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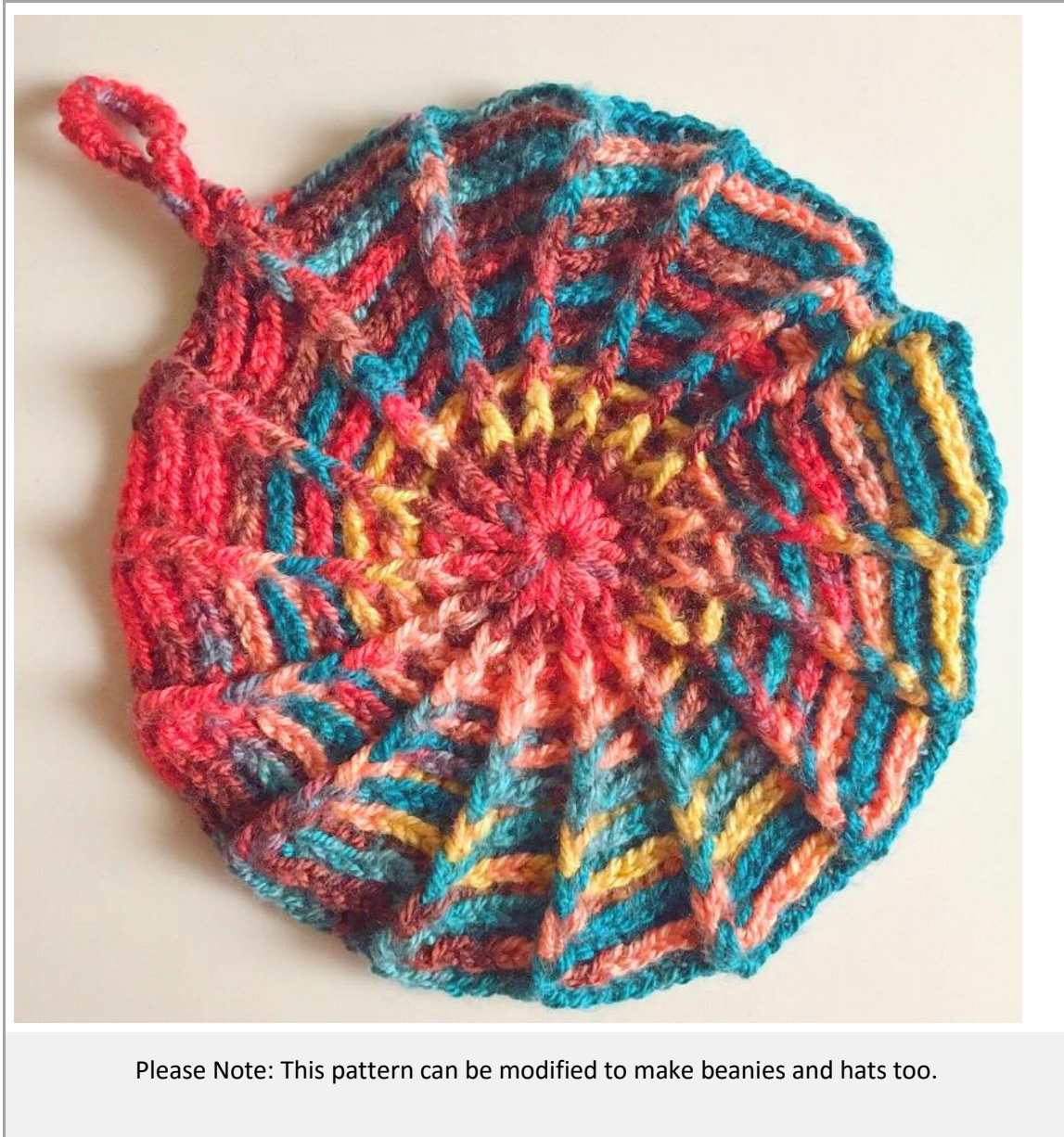

Spider Web Potholder Pattern



Please Note: This pattern can be modified to make beanies and hats too.

Materials

Variegated 100% acrylic yarn

Crochet hook

Please Note.

Every row starts with ch1 before the first FPDC except for the first row where first dc is ch3

Abbreviation

Ch- chain

St- stitch

Sl- slip stitch

Dc- double crochet

fpdc- front post double crochet

bpdc- back post double crochet

Pattern

1. Start with ch4 and join to make a ring. Ch3 and count it as first dc. 12dc into the ring. Join to first dc.
2. Ch1. fpdc over dc of previous row. Dc on the same dc of previous row. fpdc and dc on every dc of previous row all around. Join with sl st to first stitch.
3. Ch1. fpdc on the fpdc of previous row; 2 bpdc on the dc of the previous row all around.
4. Ch1. * fpdc on the fpdc of last row; 2 bpdc on the first BPdc of previous row; 1bpdc on the next bpdc . Repeat from * all around. Join to top of first fpdc
5. For all of the next rows: start with ch1. fpdc on fpdc of last row, 2bpdc on first bpdc of last row, BPdc on each of the remaining bpdc on last row all around. Join in top of first fpdc.

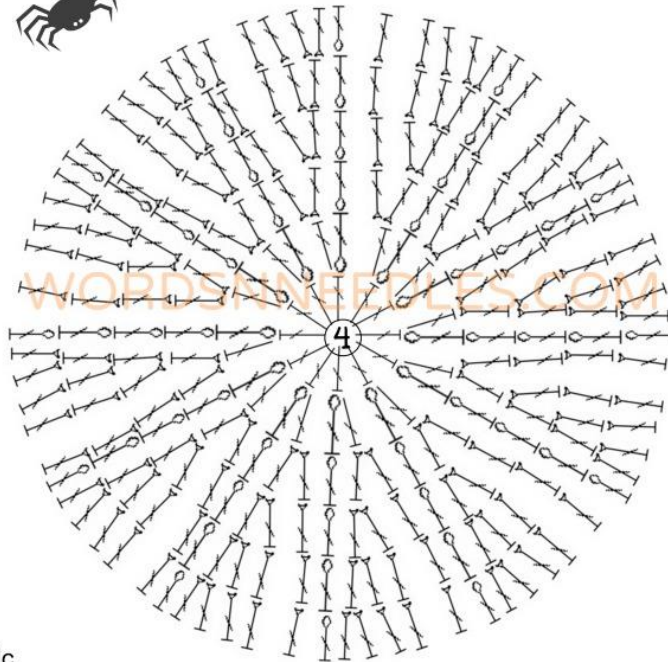
I continued till I had 10bpdc between the fpdc. Depending on the yarn you are using and also your needle size you can continue to your desire.

This pattern would look lovely as a slouchy too. Just maintain the number of stitches on the hat after you have the size of the crown. The hat should start to shape up if you stopped increasing the number of bpdc. Once you have the desired height, start the brim by alternating fpdc and bpdc to get that ridged look that looks perfect for a band. You can either finish off as it is or make the last row as reverse sc.

This is just a first few rows. Continue the same sequence in subsequent rows. Please remember the 2bpdc after the fpdc. For hats stop increasing the bpdc after you reach the required size of crown.
